I was born the 19 of Spt 1845.
My parents were Peder Jensen Poulsen
and Sidsel Katherine Andersen.
I was born in Werby, Hjorring Amt
Denmark Europe,

My parents belong to the Lutheran Church,
I, consequently belonging to that same Church
and were raised in the traditions that were
inherited by the denominations; ect,
I was vaccinated when I was ___ months old;
I was sick of the Measles when about seven
years old when seven years old started
to learn to read; started to go to
school when eight years old,
was confirmed and released from school,
when 14 years old, during that period
of time herded in the summer, & in
the winter helped to tend to my Father's
stock, when 15 years old my Father
hired me out to Niels Gregersen for one
year, commencing the 1st of Nvb. 1860, stayed
there til the 1st of Nvb. 1861,
stayed @ home in the winter of 61 & 62,
was baptized the 29 Jan 1862 by Jens Kournum,
was confirmed the 29 Jan 1862, Jense F. Mortinsen.

In 1860 my Mother joined the Church of
Jesus Christ of Latterday Saints, without my
Father knowledge or consent, he being very
much opposed to Mormonism,
in February my Mother being divorced from
my Father with the intention of Emmigrating
to Utah with the Saints.

in the latter part of Fbr Mother Johaner Marie
& Chrestian moved out to Jens Jensen Loth
Andrew & myself stayed by my Father &
completed threshing his grain crop, our
mashine; was flails, Father had a chopping mashine
he shaped all the feed for 4 head of Horses, 12.
cows, & eight head of Sheep;

In the latter part of March, Andrew
& myself moved. also out to Jens Jensen
Loths leaving Niels the only one of my

Fathers Children with him, Niels was eleven years old, my Mother did not like to leave him there to grow up in the wickedness & abomination, but could not, help herself, the Laws of the Land so overruled it, & she had to put her trust, in god and was glad to get the rest of her children along;

1862 On the 4 of Apr we left Jens Jensen Loths plase Father had previous, promised us his team to take us to Aalborg with; which he done Father was in a very unsettled condition, he had walked along on Farpagter Larsens Field, forward & back, people that seen him walking there suposed that he wanted to se us and say goodby to us or something to that effect; about 2 pm, we left the plase of our birth, Father not being at home could not say goodby to him, Niels was sendt of, so as to be shure that he should not go along with us so, we could not say goodby to him, we left our home, Father had give Mother 400 Rigsbankdoller which was anough to pay for herself & Christian's Emigration He give 80 Rigsbankdoller at dele imellem myself, Andrew & Johaner Marie, consequently we had to borrow nearly all that it would cost for us three to Emigrate for, on the 4 in the evening we arrived in Aalborg; on the 6 of April left Aalborg on a sailship; on the 7, Passed Kjoventhaun many were sick in the night, which was no wonder they being piled together in the Storage; beding & many other things piled together without buncks; or places for sleeping,

On the 8 of April arrived in Hamborg
” “15 of April left Hamborg on a Sailship named Deana, with 400 souls onboard, we passed through the Gulch which divides England & Scotland, on the 19 Apr, We landed in New York on the 3 of June, which was a pleasant and gratifying thing after a Voyage of 7 weeks, 58 Children & 3 older Adults were burried in the Sea.
We left New York 5 of June & arrived in Omaha the 10 of June, Stayed in Florenzer & got fitted up with oxen & wagons C.A. Madsen being the man that bought the Oxen and Wagons,

We left Florenzer the 14 July, traveled across the plains on foot with the exception of 1 ½ day which I was compelled to ride in as much as I had got one of my feet hurt by an ox stepping on it.

On the 22 of Spt arrived in Salt L. City, we were met there by Niels Peter Larsen from Pleasant Grove, we went in connection with Jens Jensen Loth to Pleasant Grove. There we divided the team which we had together, we got the wagon and I got the 3 oxen and then proseeded to Sanpete, & we remained in Pleasant Grove that Winter, myself & Andrew worked in American fork Kanyon that Winter, got 33 lbs of Flour pr day, we got some Furneture for Flour in SL City so that we got something to use in the house,

1863 For April we went to Guningsen, got a City lod there; built a Cellar & got some Land & we planted eight Acres of wheat raised 64 bsls,

1864 I Farmed 22 Acres of Land, I raised 200 bsls. of wheat & 160 bsl of Oats, I rented or hired a yoke of Oxen of J.C.A. Werby, paid him for the use of them 1 cow, 3 days labor with team in Manti Kanyon & 30 bsl wheat, in the fall I went out North west in connection with Frederick Mortensen to a Mail station, got \$3 dollars pr bsl of oats,

Andrew and Christian herded sheep for the people of Gunnngson.

by that means I raised money to pay Jens Jensen Loth the Money which I borrowed from him to pay my Emigration which was \$60, I bought a yoke of Oxen that fall,

1865 And in March moved to Richfield Sevier Co, in the winter & spring Andrew and myself made water ditches for 20 acres of Land each & Christian for 5 Acres. The canal being 12 feet wide and 2 feet deep, 11 miles long, we brought the water to farming land 22 April, I grub & put in seven Acres of land, raised 12 bsl wheat pr Acre 30 bsl of Oats per Acre.

1866 Farmed & built a house 13 x 16, in the spring the Indians commenced being hostile; they drove off considerable Stock among that 2, 3 years old steers of Andrew, also a one year old Hefer from him & one from Mother that year in May Albert Lewis were Killed in Marisvale & Chr Christensen mortally wounded, John Petersen & Jens Mortinsen also wounded The two latter recovered, & the former one died, we stood guard every night that summer with 22 men

& 14 to herd our Cows, which was considerable of a task raised a very light grain crop, frost killed our potato vines & a great deal of wheat

- 1867 In March the Indians made a raid on the Glenwood cowherd but got none about sunrise the Indians overtake Jens Peter Petersen & wife & Mary Smith & killed them on the foot path crossing the Hill, between the river & Glenwood, shortly after we got instruction from Prs. O. Hyde, for the setler or Sevier Co. to move back in to Sanpete Co

On the 20 of April we left Richfield for Sanpete, with what little we had left all of our improvements here & went to Fountain Green, In the summer I work in Pleasant Grove, returned to Sanpete in the fall; stayed in Mount Pleasant in the winter, earned some furniture by putting up & hauling fence for Bowman, board by A. Poulsen,

- 1868 In April moved to Fountain Green where Mother & Christian were, the town give a city lod & 5 acre of faming land; the same as the rest of the Brethren received that had no land nor City lod, I put in 5 acres of wheat, it came up & stood nice, in June the Grasshoppers went across it & left nothing but the bare ground, I then went to work in the canyon, got out loggs for a house, bought a horse from Ole Jensen for 1,000 feet of Lumber, built my house in the fall, and earned some wheat for to live of etc,

- 1869 I put in 5 acre of wheat, tended that & worked some in the Kanyon, in the summer I was given 2 ½ Acres of Hayland the same as others having none, I cut considerable hay for people that summer & done tolerable well,

- 1870 I put in my own 5 acres of land, and farmed also 8 acres un shares for Will P. Obred, got 2/3 of the crop in the spring traded with Martin Chr Christensen and got his City lod, in the summer I fenced the Lod and built a good Corell, I tended my farm, I tended some with team and got a fair team a pair of Horses,

1871 In the fore part of March I in connection with Christian went out to Richfield with some Lumber and some stoke 4 heifer and 1 Cow and calf returned to Fountain Green, & the 21 March started to go to Salt Lake un my way to Danmark the 24 arrived in S. L. City 27 received my Indowments, was ordained and Elder that day, by Elias Smith;

On 8 of April was called in general Conference to go to Danmark on a Mession On the 9 was ordained a seventy by Jens Hanson in the 65 Quorum, on the 10 was set appart to go to Danmark on my mission by Brigham Young Ju George Q. Canon & A. Karington, A Karington mouth, The 12 started in company with Canute Petersen, J.C.A. Werby, C. Madsen, H. Lund, C. Willardsen & Paul P. Deline, for Europe, The 14 arrived in Omaha, the 17 in New York, the 19 left for Englan on Steamship Yoming, the size of the Ship 55 feet wide 387 long. arrived in Liverpool 30 Apriel, left the 3 May. ” “ in Hamburg 5. I bought a Wach there for 14 Doll. we left there the 5 in the evening arrived in Kjobenhavn 6 Mai, we were tired of the jurney, stayed in Aalborg 4 days, bought some clothing act. left the 11 & arrived in Aalborg, 12, I was not very sick but C. Willardsen & J.C.A. Werby were as sick as they had been on the Jurney On the 13 arrived @ my Fathers place; it seemed a little curios to me after an absence of 9 Years, did not know my Brother Niels when I first seen him, but when seeing him smile I recognized him, I labored around my home among my relative & friends ontill the 9 of July. I was den called to preside over the Hjarring Branch, which position I held ontill the 22 Otb, I was den called to be a travling Elder in the Aalborg Conference, which position I labored in until the 22 of June 1872, was then released to return home with the Emigrants, Arrived in S. L. City 17 July was there met by A. Poulsen, C. Poulsen arrived in Richfield 23 July 1872,

I traveled 1625 miles on foot,
the whole distance & traveling in Danmark
15,005 Milles.

my expences un the whole jurney about
\$275, two hundred and seventy five Dollars,
wrote about 60 letters; received about 50.

1872 Was ordained a Teacher in Gunningson 1864
by Martin P. Mortensen,
from the 26 of July to the 16 of Agst
raked Hay. & watered in the field,

20 left there to go to S. L. City,
was married the 26 of August to
Anne Marie Christensen
returned home the 31 inst,

Sept. from the 1st to the 10 worked in the field for myself
& others. from the 10 to 30 plowed some land
while the grain stood un the Land,
I worked in the field for myself & others;

Octb. hauled Poles, hauled Oats,
fenced some on the stakyard, took up
Potatoes, etc;
19 started to Fountain Green Sanpete Co
22 sold Marie's Land (6 acres) to Jens Jensen Loth
for 25 Doll cash & one yoke of Steers 1 ½ year old,
23 sold her House and lot to Andrew Andersen Lee
for a plow, a three year old bool, & \$20 cash,
26 returned home with the Stoke, Chr Poulsen
was along and drove the Stoke;

Nvb. Toke down the old correl, built a stable correl
& Cheaken coop, hauled wood,
traded with Wm Anterton got Push,
for the Gray Horse & old Jake,

1873 Dcb was in Sanpete after the after the remaining Stoke
that I got for Marie's place,
done various chores around the home, at fixing
up un the correll, & hauling wood, etc;
paid tithing, 14 ½ bsl. of wheat 10 ½ bsl. Oats.

Jan myself & Marie was in Sanpete settled up in
full with the different parties having had
dealings with previous,
Rose had got her one foot hurt pretty bad
while we were absent,
20 hauled menure on a piese of the City lod

altogether 18 loads,
paid butter and Eggs in tithing;

Milton commenced to work for himself

Feb 15, 1901- in summer he raised beets on Halver Olsons Land & worked in Murray about 3 months came home in the fore part of Octb.

Henry O. Poulson commenced working for himself in Jany 1899. going to school etc. He attended High School in Richfield from Sept 1900 to may 1901. In Sept 1901 He went to Provo. and come home for Christmas & return a few days after new year.
